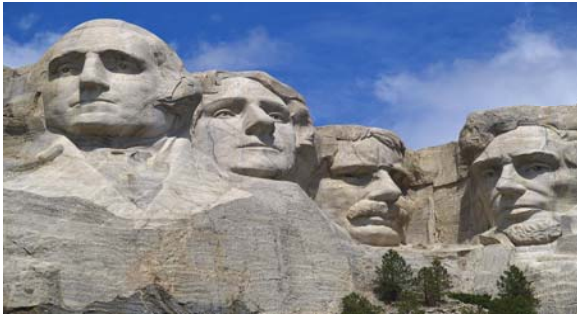

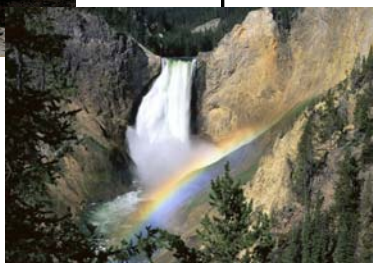
Old Faithful Snow Lodge (3 Nights)

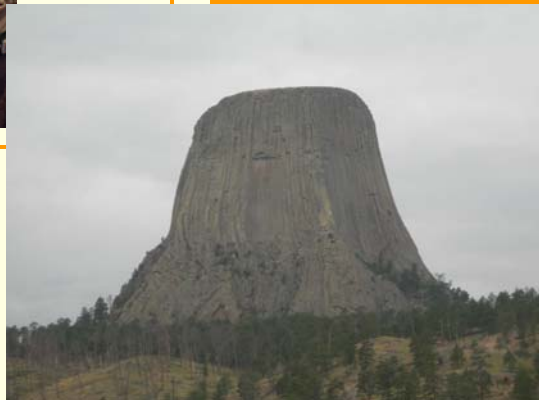


Gillette, WY (1 Night)

Because Gillette is centrally located in an area that is vital to the development of vast quantities of American coal, oil, and coal bed methane gas, the city proudly calls itself the "Energy Capital of the Nation".

Devils Tower

Visit this spectacular rock formation. The nation's 1st National Monument and is featured in movies. The nearly vertical monolith known as Devils Tower rises 1,267 feet above the meandering Belle Fourche River. Once hidden below the earth's surface, erosion has stripped away the softer rock layers revealing Devils Tower.



Known by several northern plains tribes as Bears Lodge, it is a sacred site of worship for many American Indians. The rolling hills of this 1,347 acre park are covered with pine forests, deciduous woodlands, and prairie grasslands. Deer, prairie dogs, and other wildlife are abundant.

Deadwood, SD

A side trip for shopping & gambling. The entire city of Deadwood is a national historic landmark. The famous and infamous have left their marks here. Deadwood is a living showcase of history. We just might have to "check out" the one-armed bandits in Deadwood!



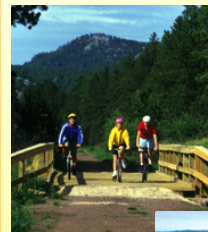
Sturgis, SD

Most famous for being the location of one of the largest annual motorcycle events in the world, usually held annually, on the first full week of August. Motorcycle enthusiasts from around the world flock to this usually sleepy town during the Sturgis Motorcycle Rally. This will be the perfect souvenir stop!



Rapid City, SD (3 NIGHTS)

Relax. Rapid City lies on the edge of the legendary Black Hills. There are mountains at their doorstep and in them you will find deep, crystal blue lakes, quiet woods, and so much to do that it's an adventure. Custer State Park and five National Parks and Monuments including Mt. Rushmore are just some of the attractions that you will find here.

The Sky Dome features the nation's first walk-through jungle filled with lizards, crocodiles, harmless snakes, parrots, and hundreds of stunning orchids and tropical plants. Visit the Giant Tortoises in their new home, where they munch on grass and soak in their mud hole.



Bear Country USA

Nestled over 250 acres amidst towering pines and along rolling meadows just eight miles south of Rapid City, Bear Country U.S.A. offers visitors intimate views of most North American mammals. Visitors take a leisurely three-mile drive through several enclosures and encounter black bear, elk, reindeer, deer, cougars, bobcats, rocky mountain goats, bighorn sheep, dall sheep and buffalo.



Crazy Horse Memorial

Crazy Horse Memorial, home of the world's largest mountain sculpture in progress, is in the Black Hills of South Dakota. The Memorial's mission is to honor the culture, tradition and living heritage of North American Indians.



Custer State Park

Custer State Park in the Black Hills encompasses 71,000 acres of spectacular terrain and an abundance of wildlife including many buffalo. Within the park, you will discover a world of adventure!



Mt. Rushmore

See this sculpture memorial - one of our nations crown jewels. Over the decades, Mount Rushmore has grown in fame as a symbol of America - a symbol of freedom and democracy and a hope for people from all cultures and backgrounds. The museum is on the site of a trading post and warehouse built along the Bordeauz Creek in 1833, surrounded by the only hilly, forested region in Nebraska. The post was operated until 1876, when it was shut down after US soldiers confiscated ammunition being sold to the Indians. Visit the spectacular visitors center and large gift shop.

The Great Platte River Road Archway- Kearney, NE

This large multi-million dollar arch museum over Interstate 80 is a must see tourist attraction. It is an interactive adventure paying tribute to the pioneers traveling west.

Buffalo Bill Sculpture - Oakley, KS
