Sorrento (Capri & Pompeii), Italy -

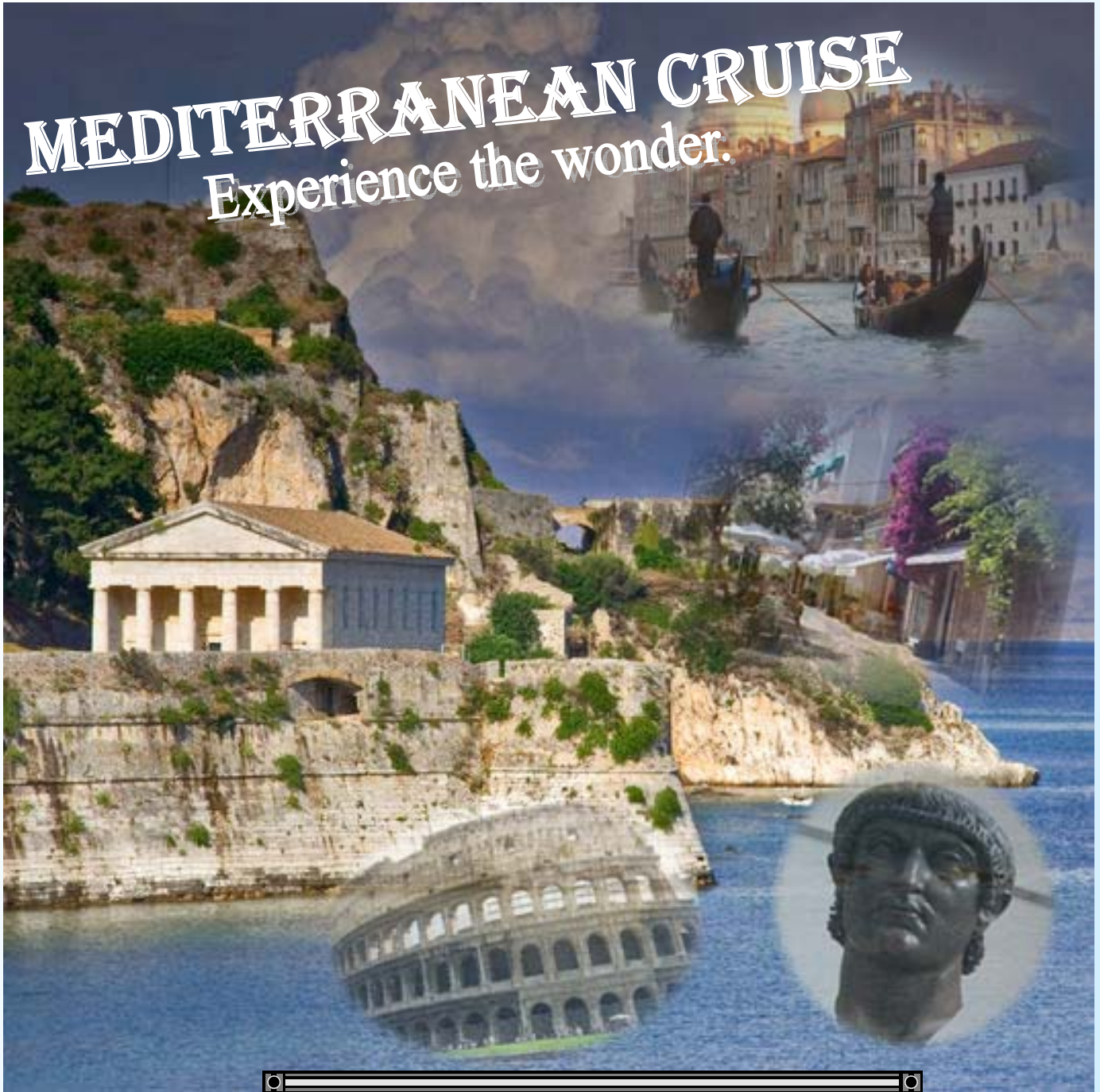

At its heart is the glamorous city of Monte Carlo, playground of the rich and famous. World-renowned for its chic gambling casinos, luxurious hotel and beach resorts, and elegant restaurants and boutiques, Monte Carlo rose to fairy tale stature in the 1950's with the romance and wedding of its sovereign ruler, Prince Rainier II, to Hollywood movie star Grace Kelly, the much beloved Princess Grace of Monaco.

The Royal Palace

The city's most dazzling residence and home to the Grimaldi family of Prince Rainier and the late Princess Grace. The majestic Italianate structure features distinctive pink walls and is a source of pride for its citizenry.

Tomb of Princess Grace

St. Nicholas Cathedral, an imposing building in the Byzantine-Renaissance style, is where the story-book wedding of the Prince and Princess took place in 1955, and is now the hallowed site of her tomb.

Grand Casino

The spectacular Grand Casino is not just a gambling establishment, but a glimpse of the playground of the rich. Soak up the ambiance of its belle epoque salons and gaming rooms, and stroll the casino's exotic and colorful public gardens.

Isle of Capri

The most sought-after island in the Bay, Capri's dramatic Blue Grotto and cliff bound scenery has drawn visitors throughout history, from Emperor Augustus to Napoleon, as well as D. H. Lawrence and George Bernard Shaw.

Sicily (Messina), Italy

Messina is the third largest city on the island of Sicily, Italy. It is located near the North-East corner of Sicily, at the Strait of Messina. The main economical resource of the city is the port, both commercial and military, with several shipyards. Agriculture includes cultivation of lemons, oranges, mandarin oranges and other fruit, vegetables and wine. Visit the **Greek Theater** that is still in use today for open-air concerts or walk around the crater of **Mt. Etna**, Europe's tallest and most active volcano.



Valletta, Malta



Valletta, the capital of Malta. Throughout the years, Valletta has welcomed emperors, heads of state, artists and poets and is now the permanent seat of the Maltese government.

Dotted with quaint cafés and wine bars, the city is today one of Malta's main tourist attractions, hosting among others, the majestic St John's Cathedral. It also provides a stunning snapshot of Malta's Grand Harbour, often described as the most beautiful in the Mediterranean.



Corfu, Greece

Paleokastritsa

The coves near this clifftop village offer some of the finest scenery in the entire Mediterranean, consisting of six, small turquoise bodies of water nestled in a hilly coastline draped in olive, cypress and lemon trees.

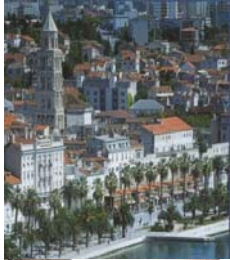
Monastery of the Virgin Mary

The 12th century monastery features a museum with a host of fascinating artifacts -- from shells and whale bones to icons and religious books.



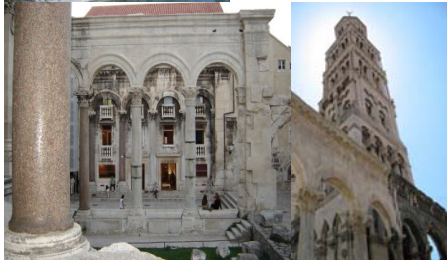
Kotor, Montenegro

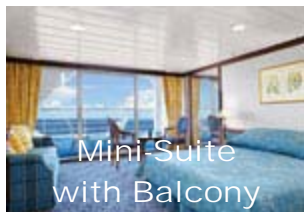

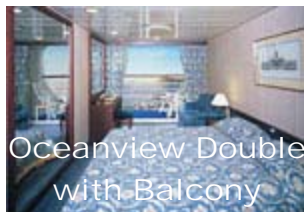
