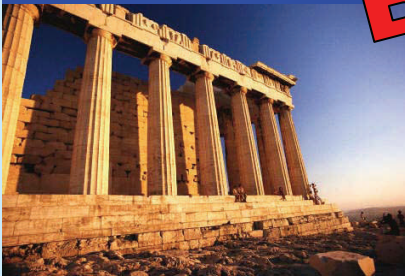

Singapore's strategic location, excellent facilities, fascinating cultural contrasts and tourist attractions contribute to its success as a leading destination for both business and pleasure.



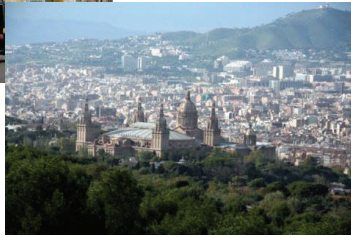
With a height of 1,453 feet, one of the world's tallest buildings rise above the skyline of Kuala Lumpur. They are called the **Petronas Towers**, and, inevitably, they have become the symbols for the astounding growth that has taken place in Malaysia over the last two decades.

Kuala Lumpur (Port Kelang), Malaysia



More than any other spot in the country, **Kuala Lumpur**, or "KL" as it is commonly known, is the capital and focal point of new Malaysia. Literally meaning "muddy estuary" in Malay, KL has grown from a small sleepy Chinese tin-mining village to a bustling metropolis of around 6.5 million (city-proper population of 1.6 million) in just 150 years. With great shopping and even better food, increasing numbers of travelers are discovering this little gem of a city.

Cochin, India



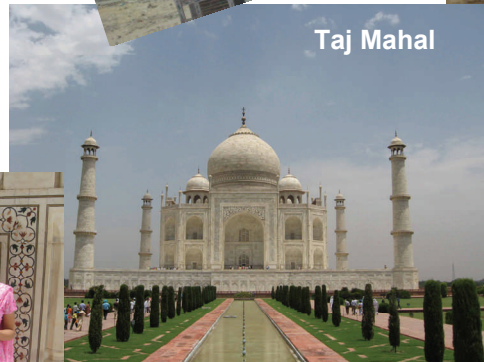
Cochin, is one of the principal seaports of the country. It is a vibrant city situated on the south-west coast of the Indian peninsula in the breathtakingly scenic and prosperous state of Kerala. Over the years, Cochin has emerged as the commercial and industrial capital of Kerala and is perhaps the second most important city on the west coast of India (after Mumbai/Bombay). While Kochi is the original name of the city, Cochin is the colonial name.

The chinese fishing nets (*Cheenavala*) are distinctly unique to Cochin. Many fishermen earn their livelihood by fishing using these massive nets. A whole stretch of the coast along Fort Kochi and Vypeen are dotted with these nets.



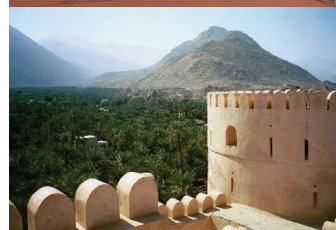
Mumbai (formerly Bombay), India

Mumbai, formerly Bombay. What constitutes the Mumbai experience? Colorful markets, stately Victorian architecture, and delectable dishes in world-class restaurants. Mumbai is the Hollywood of India. It has its own distinct sense of hope and history. Ancient yet modern, fabulously rich yet achingly poor. Observe the color and energy of the city. Mumbai was originally a conglomeration of seven islands on the Konkan coastline which over time were joined to form the island city of Bombay. The island was in turn joined with the neighboring island of Salsette to form *Greater Bombay*. The city has an estimated metropolitan population of 17 million (2005), making it one of the largest cities in the world. It is also home to India's largest slum population. Mumbai looms large as the commercial capital of as it is one of the India's predominant port cities. Mumbai's nature as the most eclectic and cosmopolitan Indian city is symbolized in the presence of *Bollywood* within the city, the centre of the globally-influential Hindi film and TV industries.



Muscat (Mina Qaboos), Oman

Oman's capital is a fascinating mix of the traditional and the modern. Discover the history and culture of Oman. Visit the Grand Mosque, a superb example of modern Islamic architecture. Wander the alleys of Muttrah Souk - the wares range from Omani daggers to silver jewelry. Travel to the Nakhl oasis, a green retreat surround by desert wastes and mountains. View the Sultan's Palace located between two 16th century Portuguese forts guarding the harbor.

bu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates

Abu Dhabi is both the capital and Federal capital of the United Arab Emirates, and is the largest of the seven emirates. This second most populous city of the UAE lies on a T-shaped island with its futuristic skyscrapers rising from the desert coast of the Persian Gulf.

Among the modern island city there are remains of an older and more cultural society. Abu Dhabi comprises of international luxurious hotels, never-ending shopping malls, extensive entertainment and leisure facilities, along beautiful green streets and parks.

The city's origin reflects its true prestige, as it was a major hub for the pearl industry before it had discovered its rich reserves of oil. Abu Dhabi is one of the most prosperous and rapidly developing cities in the world.





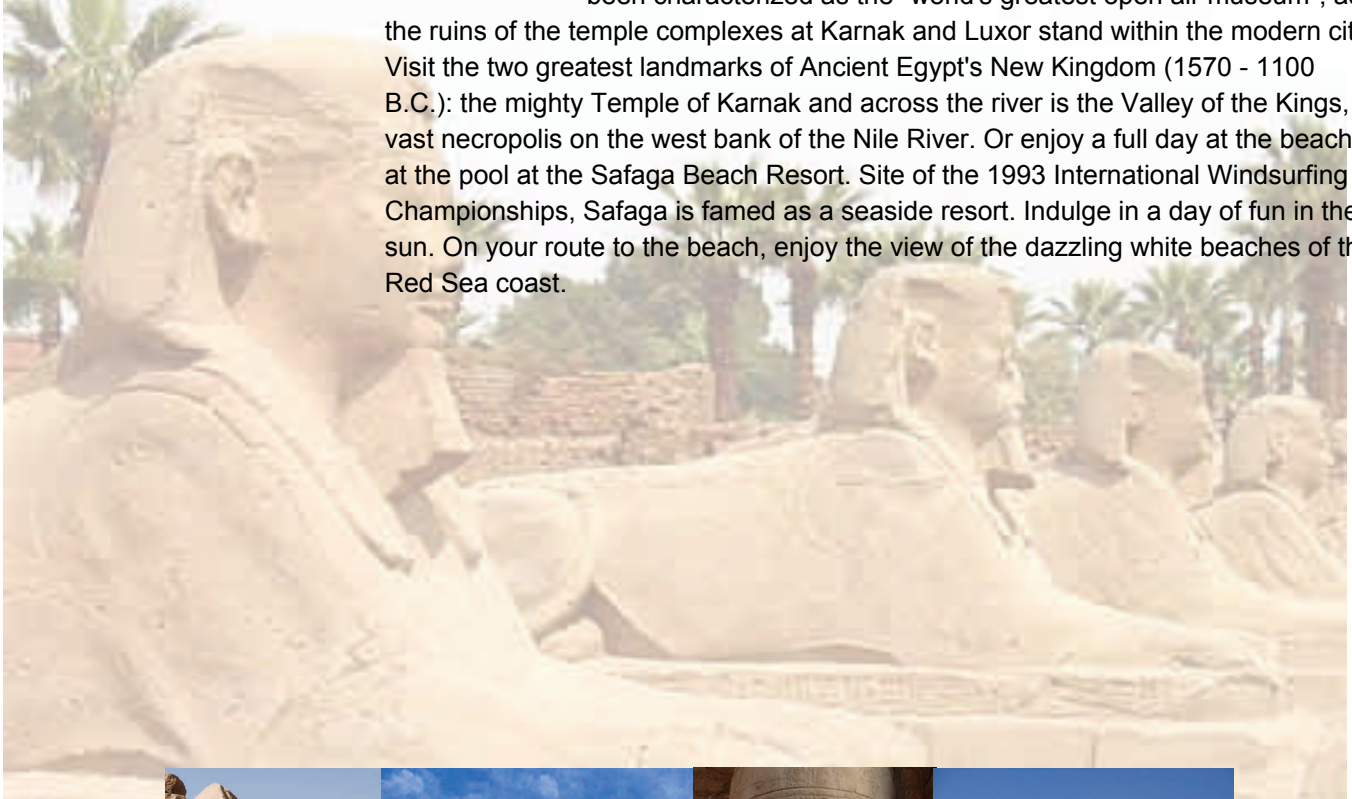
Jeddah, United Arab Emirates

Jeddah is a Saudi Arabian city located on the coast of the Red Sea and is the major urban center of western Saudi Arabia. It is the largest sea port on the Red Sea, and the second largest city in Saudi Arabia after the capital city, Riyadh.



Luxor / Karnak (Safaga), Egypt

Luxor is one of the most popular cities in Egypt. It has frequently been characterized as the "world's greatest open air museum", as the ruins of the temple complexes at Karnak and Luxor stand within the modern city. Visit the two greatest landmarks of Ancient Egypt's New Kingdom (1570 - 1100 B.C.): the mighty Temple of Karnak and across the river is the Valley of the Kings, a vast necropolis on the west bank of the Nile River. Or enjoy a full day at the beach or at the pool at the Safaga Beach Resort. Site of the 1993 International Windsurfing Championships, Safaga is famed as a seaside resort. Indulge in a day of fun in the sun. On your route to the beach, enjoy the view of the dazzling white beaches of the Red Sea coast.



Suez Canal, Egypt



The Suez Canal is an artificial sea-level waterway in Egypt, connecting the Mediterranean Sea and the Red Sea. It opened in November 1869, after a decade of construction. The canal allows water transportation between Europe and Asia without navigating around Africa. It contains no locks; seawater flows freely through the canal into the Great Bitter Lake from both the Mediterranean Sea in the north and the Red Sea in the south, replacing evaporation. It is one of the world's most heavily used shipping lanes.



Athens (Piraeus), Greece

Athens exudes a unique charm, its lively character winning over tens of thousands of visitors every year. Street markets, vine-covered tavernas, souvenir stalls and ancient monuments all form a conglomerate with buildings old and new in this city. Athens was named after Athena, the Greek goddess of wisdom, who according to mythology won the city as prize after a duel against Poseidon. The city can chart its history back thousands of years and is regarded as the cradle of western civilization; the place where democracy was invented and philosophy, art and architecture were refined.



Sorrento / Capri, Italy



Sorrento—This small town is wonderfully located over white steep cliffs and offers a fantastic view over the Bay of Naples. Sorrento lies on a Tufa terrace and is enclosed by impressive rocks of the limestone mountains. For 2000 years already visitors from all over the world have been attracted to Sorrento by breathtaking sunsets and fragrances of orange and lemon gardens.



Capri—Experience the breathtaking scenery, interesting history and the unrivaled Italian lifestyle up close and personal. Wander the streets near the Piazzetta, Capri's main square. Tour Villa San Michele, view its collection of antiquities and explore its beautiful garden. Enjoy free time to shop, sample the island cuisine, and admire the sweeping views from the gardens founded by Augustus Caesar.
