Bonaire

Bonaire is without a doubt a “diver’s paradise,” even license plates say it! But there is much more to this small Dutch country of 15,000 residents. 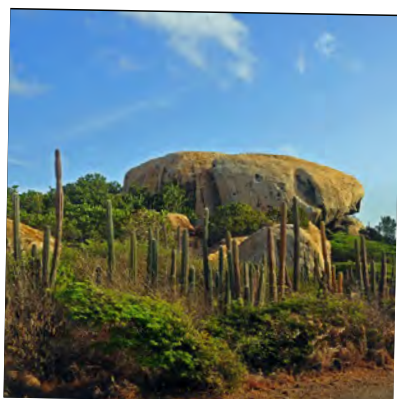
